

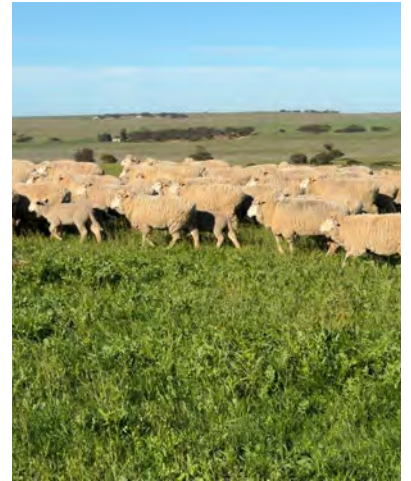

What a contrast...

While we'd all prefer to leave the challenges of recent seasons behind us, the contrast between the past few years and this season couldn't be greater. Being able to complete our seeding program before June and see this year's lambs born onto green feed, supported by regular rainfall, has been a welcome change. The season has provided ideal conditions for both our land and our sheep to thrive—let's hope these favourable conditions continue!



2026 sale team

We will be offering 180 Poll Merino rams at our on-property auction. These rams are a true reflection of the breeding objectives we have consistently pursued for many years. We strive to produce square, long-bodied sheep with excellent growth, carrying well-defined, long-stapled, bright, soft-crimping wool.

A selection of non-mulesed rams will be available. All sale rams, along with our breeding ewes, are vaccinated against John's disease, and we are a Brucellosis Accredited stud. ASBVs are available for our sale rams also.

We muscle scan our rams at 10–11 months of age to provide an objective measure of early growth, muscling and maturity. This gives producers greater confidence they are selecting sires with the genetics to produce fast-growing, well-muscled progeny that finish earlier and deliver profitable carcase performance.

2025 sales & achievements

We would like to sincerely thank everyone for their interest and support throughout 2025, along with the continued loyalty shown to Kamora Park over many years.

It is particularly pleasing to see our genetics continue to be sought after by both commercial producers and leading Poll Merino studs.

Last year, we were delighted to accept an offer of \$40,000 from Roemahkita Stud for KP 127 at Bendigo, as well as a \$20,000 offer from Millbrae Stud for KP 152 at Keith.

Our top-priced on-property sale ram, KP 586, sold to Rowan Zadow for \$9,250. While, at the Adelaide Ram Sale, KP 357 sold to Springvale North Stud for \$11,000 and KP 146 was purchased by Bradfield Stud for \$6,000.



Annual classing & breeding

We class our ewe hoggets each year, retaining 50–60%. This allows us to maintain productive older ewes through to 6.5 years of age while continually strengthening and enhancing our breeding program.

With 800–900 AI joinings annually, we are able to incorporate elite genetics sourced from across Australia, selecting top-quality sires that complement and advance our breeding objectives.

We believe profitable wool production begins with consistently filling bales. Our breeding program continues to produce sheep that cut heavy, bright, white fleeces with excellent staple length and style, while maintaining the structural soundness, resilience and performance expected in a modern Merino.
